SOCIETY of ST. VINCENT de PAUL

What started as an outreach program in the mid 19th century for the Catholic Church to support those in need and suffering has grown into a worldwide International organization creating systemic change by sharing spiritual and material support with all in need through providing employment, recycling, low cost goods and emergency financial assistance.

Incorporated in 1926, the Society of St Vincent de Paul, Tacoma-Pierce County established its current location on 56th Street in 1958 when they accepted the donation of the land where the current facility resides. Over the 90 year history of the local Tacoma-Pierce County Conference the organization has grown to provide (in 2015) over \$2.5 million worth of services throughout Pierce County at their 16 outreach branches and two thrift stores.

Executive Director, Charlie Thompson, has been with our local Society of St Vincent de Paul for three years after getting his start as a volunteer with St Vincent de Paul in Indiana over nine years ago. Having grown up in the Catholic Church, Charlie learned the value of supporting those in need from a young age.

In celebration of their 90th Anniversary of serving our local community, our Tacoma-Pierce County St Vincent de Paul is preparing this fall to launch the Getting Ahead Program where they will support 12 local participants in need in a 16-20 week mentorship program based on the book Bridges out of Poverty. Each participant will be partnered with two mentors from the local community and will be quided in creating a plan out of poverty to prosperity.

STATE FARM GRANT ARTIST SELECTED

Artist Sheila Klein was chosen in May by a selection committee to create a permanent public artwork or series of artworks along and adjacent to South Tacoma Way, between S. 47th and S. 58th Streets. The current timeline for the project proposes the artwork installation will be the summer of 2017. The City of Tacoma is working in collaboration with State Farm, Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC), and the South Tacoma Business District on this project.

Sheila Klein (Edison, WA) is a visual artist who straddles the worlds of art and architecture. She has been called "chief re-translator of everyday objects and a manipulator of familiar and archetypal images". She is making the world as she sees it, one piece at a time, using a surprising combination of materials to propose solutions to the homogenization of our environment.

She moved to the Skagit Valley and returned in 1995, where she lives on a farm with her artist husband, Ries Niemi and sons Rebar and Torque. Sheila wants to dress the world; the world is her studio.

When asked why she was interested in the South Tacoma public art project, she responded, "Tacoma is an authentic place. I can contribute an appropriate cultural asset that honors this. Tradition and innovation are hallmarks in my work. Making places more useful, smart and atmospheric, while retaining their authenticity is one of my key concepts. My works often provide additional identity and positive urban experience where interaction is key; it's about being in the work as well as seeing it."

The Tacoma Rainiers (Class AAA; Pacific Coast League) have officially been selected to host the 2017 Triple-A All-Star Game at Cheney Stadium.

The 30th annual Triple-A All-Star Game will take place on Wednesday, July 12, capping a three-day schedule of events, MLB Network will present a live broadcast of the game.
